How?

Your parish or deanery could run a pilgrimage to Liverpool for your candidates and give them chance to explore the cathedral and let them learn about the history of the church in Liverpool.

Young people may find it fascinating to learn about the history we share in this part of the world.

They may be very interested in learning what their grandparents and great-grandparents did to build the church in the Diocese and how they are following in their footsteps, and through Confirmation they are now responsible for passing on the flame of faith to the next generation.

A significant part of the life of our church in Liverpool is also our ecumenical relations so a joint trip to the Anglican cathedral might also be appropriate.

Of course, you might also want to visit other local pilgrimage sites in the region as well.
